

Intermediate Skills in Plastic Surgery: Facial Soft Tissue Reconstruction

The aim of this course is to develop operative skills in the selection, design and execution of a number of useful, common surgical flaps for reconstruction following excision of skin lesions. The basic principles will be practiced on mannequins with pig skin, and participants will then progress to more complicated procedures using unembalmed cadaveric heads.

- Forehead and temple
 - Rhomboid/dufourmental flap
 - Forehead flap
- Lip and chin
 - V-Y flap
- Cheek & Ear
 - Hatchet flap
 - McGregor flap
